

FY 26 Ohio Virtual Academy Student Wellness and Success Plan

Background from The Ohio Department of Education

Aligned with [Ohio's Whole Child Framework](#), the Student Wellness Funds assist schools and districts, alongside community partners, to address the needs of the whole child by funding initiatives to support wraparound services for Ohio's students.

Recent updates to the requirements include spending at least 50% of the Student Wellness and Success Funds on physical and mental health services, collaborating with both a community mental health provider and another community partner, sharing the plan and any amendments within 30 days with a governing body and posting the plan to the school's website, reporting annually on spent funds, and spending funds by the end of the next fiscal year after they were received.

Using Data to Identify Critical Needs

During the 24-25 school year, 76 students were referred for critical mental health or hospitalization, 20 students were referred to OHVA's mental health partners Syntero, 1082 students were referred to small groups, and 13 referrals were made to the Cornerstone Grief Group. There were 109 mental health hospitalizations and 84 physical health hospitalizations. Ohio Virtual Academy also had 549 homeless students during the 24-25 school year. Students continue to struggle after the pandemic and need support from trained professionals. Additionally, our families continue to need resources to help them support students in their wellness.

Goals and Strategies

Our goal with this fund is to increase student wellness by leveraging counselors, wrap around services, and family engagement to support the whole child needs of our students. This aligns with our continuous improvement plan SMART goal dealing with School Climates and Supports: Safe and Healthy Schools.

Implementation Plan

In order to meet our goal, we are partnering with Syntero, a community-based mental health treatment provider, and Cornerstone of Hope, a nonprofit bereavement support center. Syntero will support Ohio Virtual Academy through additional resources such as content expertise, data sources, and joint planning. Cornerstone's therapy and counseling services will provide support group help and guidance on the plan.
